WELCOME

AS WE GATHER

In this Epiphany season, the light of Christ reveals both our deep need for God's mercy and the gracious righteousness He freely gives. Today's readings contrast outward religious performance with the true "fast" God desires—a life shaped by His compassion, justice, and love. Jesus calls His people the salt of the earth and the light of the world not because of their own goodness, but because He has fulfilled the Law perfectly for them. Strengthened by His forgiveness in Word and Sacrament, we are sent to reflect His mercy in our daily callings, sharing bread with the hungry, lifting up the oppressed, and shining with the light that Christ first shines into us.

IMAGE ON THE COVER

Isaiah 58:6–9 depicts Christ-centered acts of mercy radiating from the cross—figures freeing captives, sharing bread, and clothing the poor, all illuminated by Epiphany light.

CONFSSION AND ABSOLUTION

P In the light of Christ, we see both the depth of our sin and the greatness of His mercy. Let us come before our gracious God with humble hearts, seeking His forgiveness and renewal.

C **Merciful Father, we confess that we have often honored You with our lips while our hearts have wandered. We have trusted in outward works while neglecting justice, mercy, and love. We have hidden our light, withheld our compassion, and turned from those in need. For the sake of Jesus Christ—who fulfilled the Law for us, who is our righteousness, and who shines upon us with grace—have mercy on us. Forgive our sins, renew our hearts, and lead us to walk in Your ways, that our lives may reflect Your light.**

P Almighty God, in His mercy, has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. Christ Jesus—your righteousness, your peace, your light—has loosed the bonds of your guilt and set you free. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the  Son and of the Holy Spirit.

EPISTLE

1 Corinthians 2:1-16

(Paul speaks and writes in and with the Spirit's power.)

¹And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. ²For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. ³And I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling, ⁴and my speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, ⁵that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.

⁶Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. ⁷But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. ⁸None of the rulers of this age understood this, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,
nor the heart of man imagined,
what God has prepared for those who love him”—

¹⁰these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. ¹²Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God. ¹³And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual.

¹⁴The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. ¹⁵The spiritual person judges all things, but is himself to be judged by no one. ¹⁶“For who has understood the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?” But we have the mind of Christ.

¹⁹*Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.”*

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE: **Matthew 5:17 – “Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.”** We cannot keep the Law of God perfectly.
