WELCOME

AS WE GATHER

On the Mount of Transfiguration, Jesus shines—not only with divine brilliance, but with the glory of the cross and resurrection already breaking into the present. “After six days,” Matthew tells us, evoking both Sinai’s cloud and creation’s rhythm. The seventh day will bring rest in the tomb; the eighth day will dawn with resurrection. But here, in the sixth, Jesus glows with the light of the new creation. Moses and Elijah appear, pointing to the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. The Father speaks: “This is My beloved Son... listen to Him.” And the disciples fall in fear—until Jesus touches them and says, “Rise, and have no fear.” Today, we behold His glory, hear His Word, and walk with Him down the mountain, knowing that “Jesus only” is enough. The appointed readings from Exodus and 2 Peter both echo this truth: the glory of God is revealed in the face of Christ, and His Word is our light in the valley.

The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the Pastor or an elder. FAREWELL TO ALLELUIA

Ecclesiastes 3:1–4, 7, alt.

P This week, on Ash Wednesday, we begin our observance of Lent. To highlight the penitential nature of the season, it has been the custom in the church to suspend the use of the word *alleluia*, which means “Praise the Lord.” The tradition not to use the joyful word *alleluia* in worship from the conclusion of worship on the final Sunday before Lent until the first service on Easter Sunday has been in place since the fifth century. The text of the hymn “Alleluia, Song of Gladness” (LSB 417) dates back to the 11th century and links us to a millennium of God’s people at worship. We will repeat words from the book of Ecclesiastes, which remind us that there are appropriate times for all things, including a time to keep silence, which we will observe regarding use of the alleluia throughout Lent.

P For everything there is a season,
C **and a time for every matter under heaven:**

P a time to be born, and a time to die;
C **a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;**

P a time to break down, and a time to build up;
C **a time to weep, and a time to laugh;**

P a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
C **a time to keep silence, and a time to speak.**

P As part of our observance of a holy Lent as it begins this week, we now say farewell to the alleluia until the time of our rejoicing anew at the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Day.
