AS WE GATHER

On this most joyful day, we gather to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. The women at the tomb were met with the astonishing news that Jesus, once crucified, now lives and goes ahead of His people. Through the prophet Jeremiah, God promised that His people would again be restored and rejoice in His steadfast love. And in the Epistle, St. Paul proclaims that because Christ has been raised, those who belong to Him already share in His risen life—our lives now hidden with Christ in God, awaiting the day when He appears in glory. Today we rejoice that the resurrection is not only Christ's victory but also the source of our hope, our identity, and our future. Alleluia!

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Yet we also confess that our hearts and minds have not always been set on “the things that are above” (*Colossians 3:2*). The Lord has loved us with an everlasting love (*Jeremiah 31:3*), but we have not always walked in that love. Let us come before our gracious God in repentance and faith.

C You are our life, yet we have lived as though our lives were our own. You call us to seek the things that are above, but we have been preoccupied with the things of earth. You have raised us with Yourself in Baptism, but we have returned to old sins, old fears, and old ways. You have loved us with an everlasting love, yet we have not loved You with our whole heart or our neighbors as ourselves. Forgive us, renew us, and restore us, that we may walk in the new life You have given. Amen.

P “Do not be afraid,” the angel said to the women at the tomb, “for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for He has risen” (*Matthew 28:5–6*). Because Christ lives, your sins are forgiven. Because Christ lives, your life is hidden with Him in God (*Colossians 3:3*). Because Christ lives, you will appear with Him in glory (*Colossians 3:4*).

P Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the Pastor or an elder. For further study, see Matt. 5:23ff; 10:32ff; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:17-34.

DISTRIBUTION

The pastor and those who assist him receive the body and blood of Christ first. They then distribute the body and blood of Christ to those in the pews who are unable to come forward, and then finally to those who come forward.

Distribution and dismissal will be done by half tables.
