AS WE GATHER

On this Day of Pentecost, we rejoice that the risen Christ keeps His promise to pour out the Holy Spirit upon His people. Long before the rushing wind of **Acts 2**, the Lord placed His Spirit on the seventy elders in **Numbers 11**, showing that His power is never limited to one person but shared for the good of His whole people. Today that same Spirit is poured out on the Church—creating faith, uniting believers, and sending us into the world as witnesses of Christ. As Jesus promises in **John 7**, the Spirit is living water flowing from Him to us, and from us into a thirsty world. Where the Spirit flows, life grows; and gathered by that Spirit, we come to receive His gifts with joy.

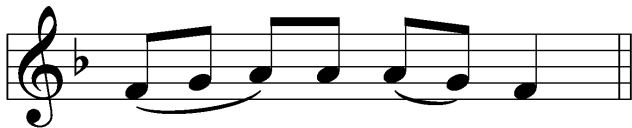

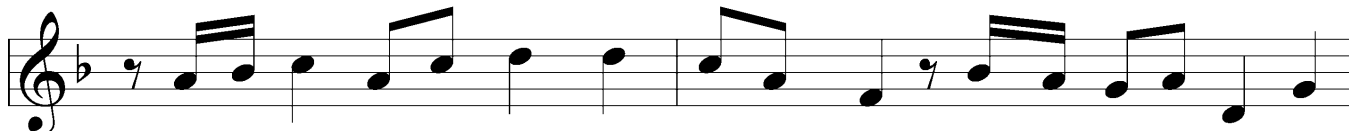

Numbers 11:24-30

(Moses and the Israelites anticipate the day when the Lord pours out His Spirit on all His people.)

²⁴Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. ²⁵Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it.

²⁶Now two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the Spirit rested on them. ⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were amazed and astonished, saying, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, ¹¹both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.” ¹²And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” ¹³But others mocking said, “They are filled with new wine.”

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. ¹⁵For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. ¹⁶But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:

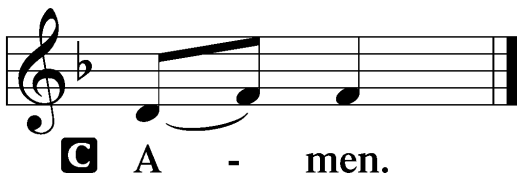

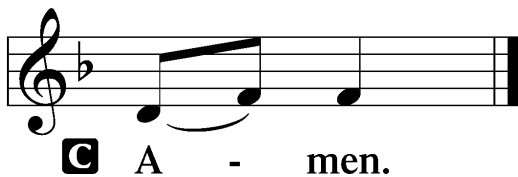
