Even as our hymnal is filled with hymns that are appropriate for the liturgical calendar, our hymnal is a doctrinal book of poems, beautifully adorned with musical notes. I encourage you to pause and enjoy the gift we have in our hymnody.

Advent – "The everlasting Son / Incarnate deigns to be, Himself a servant's form puts on / To set His servants free" (*LSB* 331, St. 2).

Christmas – "Christ, by highest heav'n adored, Christ, the everlasting Lord, Late in time behold him come, Offspring of a virgin's womb. Veiled in flesh the Godhead see, Hail the incarnate Deity! Please as Man with man to dwell, Jesus, our Immanuel!" (*LSB* 380, St. 2).

Christmas (*Presentation of Jesus*) – "Lord, bid Your servant go in peace, Your word is now fulfilled. These eyes have seen salvation's dawn, This child so long foretold" (*LSB* 937, St. 1).

Christmas (Jesus at the age of 12) – "The doctors of the Law / Gaze on the wondrous child /And marvel at His gracious words / Of wisdom undefiled" (LSB 410, St. 2).



The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?

Here is a way you can support St. Luke's and qualify for a tax break at the same time."

What is a Qualified Charitable Contribution (QCD)?

A QCD is a withdrawal from a traditional IRA which goes directly to a qualified charity. If done correctly this withdrawal and contribution does not add to Federal or State Taxable Income or Adjusted Gross Income. You do not have to itemize on taxes to take advantage of this giving opportunity.

The basic requirements are:

- 1) The withdrawal must be from a Traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA). (If you have a 401K or 403 B funds can be rolled to a traditional IRA first to make this work.)
- 2) The IRA owner must be at least 70.5 years old.
- 3) The money must go directly to a qualified charity. St. Luke's is qualified. The recommended approach is to have the check made out to St. Luke's Lutheran Church and have it mailed to you and you deliver. Make a copy of the check and deliver to St. Luke's so you know all was done correctly.
- 4) When reporting taxes, the withdrawal is reported and if the QCD options are appropriately load and calculated on your tax forms this withdrawal will not be a taxable event..
- 5) If you are of the age of Required Minimum Distribtuions (RMD) the QCD can count towards your RMD requirements. (The RMD age is changing from 70.5 top 72 years of age depending on your age.)
- 6) The maximum qualified QCD is \$100,000 per year per individual. IRA's are individually owned. So if each spouse has their own IRA, each can do a QCD.
