AS WE GATHER

In 2009, the *New York Times* reported on a study finding the average American consumed about 34GB of data and information each day. Since that report, and over a decade later, the amount our brains consume daily is estimated to have more than doubled. In short, we are exposed to a lot of information and a lot of noise! Yet how many of those consuming "voices" around us bring peace, comfort, and hope? Amid a noisy world, there is only one voice that truly gives us what we need. The Word of Christ is the voice that heals the sick and raises the dead (Mark 5:21–43). The Word of Christ is the voice that reminds us His mercies are new every morning with His great faithfulness (Lamentations 3:23).
