When I have folks who are considering membership, I am honored in the fall and spring to teach the class, *Christianity and Lutheranism: Pastor's New Member Class*. This class has gone by different names over the years – *Inquirer's Class*, *God Connects*, *Life's Biggest Questions and God's Comforting Answers*. But I've settled on this title because I think it explains the topic rather nicely. I usually offer the class on Sundays, 2:00-3:30 p.m.



The class lasts about 9 (or 10) weeks. Yes, that's a long time. But I've discovered over the years that to properly cover the topic, we need that time. The topics are: Why Jesus?; The Bible (which includes Apologetics, Bible Stories, and Hermeneutics (or Rules of Interpretation); The 10 Commandments; The Creed; The Lord's Prayer; The Means of Grace; Baptism; Confession & Absolution and the Office of the Keys; The Lord's Supper; and Eschatology (or End Times). You may have noticed that the six chief parts of the catechism are embedded in this outline.

Do I demand that folks have to take this class before becoming a member. I do not. I consider their background and how involved they were in their previous church before they came to us. Maybe we simply need to sit down and discuss the differences between Lutheranism and the church from where they came. But I do encourage them to consider coming to the class. It will certainly do them no harm, and chances are, it will be a blessing to them. That same logic applies to members as well. If you are a longtime member and would like a refresher course, please consider being a part of this class in the fall.

Will you be traveling during the summer months? If so, please keep a couple things in mind.

- 1. Wherever you are at, please go to church! Our soul continually needs the nutrients of the Gospel. And please bring us back a bulletin. We will publish where you've been under the title, "Traveling Bulletin."

We are boldly and unapologetically pro-life.

St. Luke's is a congregation of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). We believe that abortion is contrary to God's Word and "is not a moral option, except as a tragically unavoidable byproduct of medical procedures necessary to prevent the death of another human being, viz., the mother" (1979 Res. 3-02A).

This is a controversial topic in our society. Not many people enjoy controversy, but we are also aware that if we are not permitted to state what we believe, people will not know what we believe. With this in mind, I want to share with you over the next few of months how you might respond to pro-abortion arguments.

When someone says: "Abortion is okay as long as it's before they're viable outside the womb," we could respond:

The official "age of viability" is currently set at 24 weeks (even though babies have survived outside the womb earlier than that – the current record is 21 weeks and 5 days). So what changes between 24 and 23 weeks and 6 days? Once the clock strikes midnight, does the fetus suddenly become a baby? No matter what time you point to during the 9 months of pregnancy, the child will always be a living human being. Arbitrarily drawing a line at a specific age a person needs to reach in order to secure their right to life is dangerous, inconsistent, and unreasonable.



The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.


