(We are more than conquerors in Christ and in Christ alone!)

If God is for us, who can be against us? ³²He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ³³Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

- A Let us pray for the whole people of God and for all people according to their needs.
- Lord, we ask in Your mercy to hear and answer our prayers.

- Almighty God, You created this world from nothing, and by Your will it exists to this day;
- yet there is coming a day when You will be revealed, the world will be judged, and we will be home forever.
- **A** We know that we are but strangers here;
- heaven is our home. Bring us home as You have planned before the creation of the world.
- A We look around our world, and we do not understand it;
- we see things we do not understand, such as violence against others, and our hearts are broken.

- C Amen.




