AS WE GATHER

Sometimes one simple word can have two meanings that are complete opposites. The word *anxious* is one of them. In English, it comes from the old Latin verb "angere," which means to "take hold of" or "to give pain." When Jesus says, "Do not be anxious," He is inviting us to let go of that which causes us pain and to trust in God's complete and loving care. And yet the flip side of "angere" describes a positive sense of eagerness. In the Advent hymn "Come, Thou Precious Ransom, Come" (*LSB* 350), we pray to our Savior: "Come, Thy beauty let us see; anxiously we wait for Thee" (st. 1). May our faithful worship reflect that hopeful kind of anxiety as we celebrate the presence of the Lord among us.











PRAYER OF THE DAY

SUMMER SAINT CELEBRATION SEQUENCE

Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr

- The list of Christians who are remembered by the church and commemorated by name includes faithful men and women from centuries past who witnessed to Jesus Christ in special ways in their lives. On August 10, the church commemorates Lawrence, who is known as a deacon and martyr. Born in Spain around AD 220, Lawrence found his way to Rome, where he served as a deacon, caring for the social and physical needs of people. His responsibilities included sending out financial contributions from God's people at Rome to congregations in need around the Empire. He used all the resources he was given to meet local needs in Rome as well. When the Roman prefect demanded that Lawrence bring him all the wealth of the church within three days, he knew that he had no silver or gold to turn over. After the three days, he brought before the prefect some of the people who had been helped by the church: destitute, sick, and blind people, as well as widows and many poor people. He said to the prefect: "The church is truly rich, far richer than your emperor." The prefect was outraged by Lawrence's response and decreed that he be put to death immediately, which he was. The willing sacrifice of his own life in the service of God's people as a martyr was a compelling testament to the faith of Lawrence, who was about thirty-eight years old at the time of his execution. Martin Luther observed that Lawrence overcame death and all tortures and serves as a blessed example of Christian faithfulness.
- One of the sections of hymns in *Lutheran Service Book* has the heading "The Church Militant" above each hymn in that section. Included in this group of hymns are Martin Luther's "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," the well-known "Onward, Christian Soldiers," and "Fight the Good Fight." The term "The Church Militant" refers to the church on earth, where Christian people live out their faith day by day. Sometimes that calling to follow Christ leads to conflict and self-sacrifice, and sometimes even to death.

In the hymn, "The Son of God Goes Forth to War," English clergyman Reginald Heber calls to mind some of those faithful followers who make up the army of Christ, including martyrs and valiant saints. The hymn ends with a simple prayer we all can share: "O God, to us may grace be giv'n to follow in their train!"

¹Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²For by it the people of old received their commendation. ³By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible.

⁴By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. ⁵By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. ⁶And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. ⁷By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

⁸By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. ¹¹By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. ¹²Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.


¹³These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. ¹⁴For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return.

¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.



Of how much more value are you than the birds! ²⁵And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? ²⁶If then you are not able to do as small a thing as that, why are you anxious about the rest? ²⁷Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ²⁸But if God so clothes the grass, which is alive in the field today, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you, O you of little faith! ²⁹And do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, nor be worried. ³⁰For all the nations of the world seek after these things, and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹Instead, seek his kingdom, and these things will be added to you.

Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. ³⁴For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."






