AS WE GATHER

The message of the cross is foolishness to the world, but to us who are being saved, it is the very power of God. Today, as we reflect on Paul's words to the Corinthians, we also give thanks for the work of Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM), whose global outreach proclaims Christ crucified to people in every nation and culture. Through radio, digital media, and personal witness, LHM brings the wisdom of God—hidden in the cross and revealed in Christ—to those who are perishing, that they too may know the hope of salvation. As we gather, we rejoice that God chooses the weak, the lowly, and the overlooked to carry His Gospel into the world. In Word and Sacrament, we are strengthened to boast not in ourselves, but in the Lord who saves.

OPENING SENTENCES

Psalm 1, Psalm 15, and 1 Corinthians 1

P Blessed is the one who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, nor stand in the way of sinners, nor sit in the seat of scoffers.
C **But whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and on His law meditates day and night.**

P O Lord, who may dwell in Your tent? Who may stand upon Your holy hill?
C **Only the one who is righteous and speaks truth in the heart.**

P Yet the wisdom of the world cannot make us righteous, and our strength cannot make us stand.
C **But the word of the cross is the power of God for all who are being saved.**

P Let us then come before the Lord, poor in spirit and rich in His mercy, seeking the blessing that comes only through Christ crucified.

CONFESSiON AND ABSOLUTION

Micah 6:1–8, Matthew 5:1–12, and 1 Corinthians 1

P Holy and gracious God, You have shown us what is good: to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with You. Yet we confess that we have walked in pride, trusted our own wisdom, and sought our worth apart from Your grace.
C **Lord, have mercy on us.**

P You call the poor in spirit blessed, but we have clung to our own strength. You bless the meek, but we have insisted on our own way. You bless the peacemakers, but we have stirred up conflict in our homes, our congregation, and our world.

C **Christ, have mercy on us.**

P You choose the foolish, the weak, and the lowly, yet we have despised weakness— in others and in ourselves. You choose what the world overlooks to display the power of Christ, yet we have chased after the world’s approval and forgotten who we are in Him.

C **Lord, have mercy on us.**

P For the sake of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen for us, forgive our sins, renew our hearts, and turn us again to the wisdom of the cross.

C **Amen.**

P Almighty God, in His mercy, has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins.

The One who calls you is faithful. The crucified Christ— the wisdom and power of God— has taken your sin and given you His righteousness; has taken your weakness and given you His strength; has taken your death and given you His life.

Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the  Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C **Amen.**

P You are blessed in Christ. You are forgiven. You are His— redeemed, restored, and made new in Him.

C **Thanks be to God.**

²⁰Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²²For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

²⁶For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. ²⁷But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, ²⁹so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. ³⁰He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom and our righteousness and sanctification and redemption. ³¹Therefore, as it is written, “Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.”

This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the Pastor or an elder. For further study, see Matt. 5:23ff; 10:32ff; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:17-34.
